# **Keewatin announces promising results from the Sky Harvest wind resource assessment report.**

In March 2007, **Keewatin Windpower Corp. (OTCBB: KWPW)** announced that it had entered into an agreement with Sky Harvest Windpower Corp., a private Canadian company, whereby Keewatin will acquire all of its issued and outstanding share capital.

Chris Craddock, President and C.E.O., of Keewatin is pleased to announce that results from the Sky Harvest wind assessment report confirm a strong and consistent wind resource.

Mr. Craddock says “it is important to correlate our data with other weather monitoring stations and this process allows our professionals to then create a long term wind resource prediction. We have completed this report and we now know that we have an economically sound site that we can finance.”

Phoenix Engineering, of Calgary Alberta has the full responsibility of data collection and resource assessment at the Sky Harvest site.

With respect to the consistency of the wind at the site and the ideal wind speeds, David Baker, President of Phoenix Engineering says “Wind data at the Sky Harvest site is consistent with other strong wind farm sites in Canada.”
